

Mohegan Sun: An Overview, An Evolution

What began in 1996 opening with the Casino of the Earth has evolved into the East Coast's premier entertainment, meeting, shopping and gaming destination.

Today more than 35,000 daily visitors test their luck and skill at Mohegan Sun's two casinos, shop and dine at more than 60 dining and premium retail outlets, and find the finest entertainment at three world-class venues. The 1,200-room luxury hotel at Mohegan Sun, complete with 100,000 square feet of premier meeting space and a pampering spa is just steps away, offering guests legendary facilities and an opportunity to relax and rejuvenate.

To create a destination that transports visitors to a world like no other, Mohegan Sun embarked upon a \$1 billion expansion, the largest private development project on the East Coast during its two-year duration. A unique collaboration of several of the world's most renowned architectural and design firms has brought the art of themed décor to new heights, creating inventive elements and environments throughout the entire 3.5 million square foot property.

Construction is currently underway on Project Horizon, a multimillion dollar expansion that adds a second hotel, partnership with House of Blues, additional gaming, retail, dining and entertainment space. Upon completion in 2010, Project Horizon will add an additional 1.4 million square feet to the property.

Unparalleled Gaming Excitement

Mohegan Sun's Casino of the Earth is comprised of nearly 180,000 square feet of gaming space and features more than 3,600 slot machines, a non-smoking slot hall, and 206 gaming tables that include such perennial favorites as blackjack, craps, roulette, Caribbean stud poker, keno and baccarat.

It is also home to some of the East Coast's most distinct gaming features, including a Race Book that offers live racing from New York (Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga) –

the only such facility in New England. The addition of the 119,000 square-foot Casino of the Sky makes Mohegan Sun one of the world's largest casino complexes and continues a grand tradition of excitement, Mohegan-style.

From rousing games of skill and chance, the Casino of the Sky features over 100 tables, thousands of slots, a high-limit lounge and two special non-smoking gaming areas. Set high above the Casino of the Sky is the world's largest, fully functional planetarium dome. Just one of the show-stopping elements of Mohegan Sun, the planetarium features ever-changing fiber-optic displays of the sun, moon and stars and is accompanied by the lighting effects of Wombi Rock, a multi-level onyx and alabaster entertainment and lounge venue.

Dining

Mohegan Sun is pulling out all the stops to deliver incomparable gaming, entertainment and dining experiences. With a wide variety of dining choices comprising more than 3,000 seats, every culinary expectation is exceeded at Mohegan Sun. Whether it's a delicious Italian feast at Pompeii and Caesar, a twist on one of your old favorites at Birches Bar & Grill, or a gourmet meal prepared at Michael Jordan's Steak House, Jasper White's Summer Shack or Todd English's Tuscany, nothing is left to chance.

Guaranteed crowd pleasers also include the Sunburst and Seasons Buffets, Geno Auriemma's Fast Break and the Casino of the Earth Food Court. Rounding out the food and beverage options are choices that have won rave reviews elsewhere in the country including: Johnny Rockets, Big Bubba's BBQ, Ben & Jerry's and Starbucks Coffee.

Shopping

The Shops at Mohegan Sun feature more than 60 restaurant and retail outlets and offer visitors the ultimate in national brands, a wide selection of one-of-a-kind treasures, fine apparel, antiques, jewelry, custom furniture, crafts and hand-crafted Native American goods. The 130,000 square-foot premium retail area, designed by The Rockwell Group, depicts the Mohegan Tribe's historic journey east to Connecticut.

Entertainment

Mohegan Sun's 10,000-seat Arena, 350-seat Cabaret Theatre and 300-seat Wolf Den are home to electrifying performances and legendary events. Past Arena performers include the best from every generation and genre from Aerosmith and Justin Timberlake to Keith Urban, Van Halen, Gwen Stefani, and Bon Jovi. Mohegan Sun Arena is also home to a number of championship sporting events, as well as our own WNBA team, the Connecticut Sun.

The renowned Wolf Den, a stunning 300-seat venue in the heart of Casino of the Earth, features free nightly entertainment for guests 21 and over. Legendary acts from almost every musical genre such as Exposé, America, Eddie Money, Kansas, Soul Asylum, and Warrant have performed in the Wolf Den, all at no cover charge and no minimum.

The uniquely crafted 350-seat Cabaret Theatre showcases intimate performances from comedy to acoustic concerts. The Cabaret Theatre has hosted musical powerhouses such as Air Supply, Neil Sedaka, Chris Botti and Tony Orlando. Tickets for both Mohegan Sun Arena and The Cabaret Theatre can be purchased at Mohegan Sun's on-site Box Office or through ticketmaster.com or by calling local Ticketmaster outlet.

Nightlife

The nightlife at Mohegan Sun has also evolved, going from gaming, concerts, sports, shopping and dining into Mohegan After Dark, an \$8 million, 22,000 square-foot complex that features three individually-themed lounges and night clubs - Lucky's Lounge, The Dubliner and Ultra 88 Night Club.

Located along The Shops at Mohegan Sun and owned and operated by The Lyons Group in Boston, Massachusetts, Mohegan After Dark is a one-of-a-kind destination for evening entertainment in Connecticut. The complex accommodates 60-800 people and is open daily. It is also available for private functions. Lucky's Lounge is the East Coast's first Las Vegas-style restaurant and lounge; The Dubliner is an authentic Irish

pub; and the Ultra 88 Night Club is one of Connecticut's most exclusive nightclubs with VIP seating throughout.

Luxury Hotel

When a day of excitement is complete, guests will find soothing repose at Mohegan Sun's 1,200-room luxury hotel, which was unveiled in April 2002. The 30,000 square-foot lobby, designed by The Rockwell Group, sets a dramatic albeit peaceful scene that includes a simulated cedar forest. Here water gurgles playfully in reflecting pools and light dances through canopies of beaded crystalline leaves on trees that reach toward luminous sky lights.

Mohegan Sun's spacious guest rooms – including 180 suites –feature a minimum of 450 square feet per room. Each provides luxurious bathrooms, deluxe bedding and linens, three two-line telephones with dataports, a full-size working desk area with an ergonomic chair and more.

The full-service Elemis Spa at Mohegan Sun, in addition to a salon and fitness center, leaves guests feeling renewed. A professional spa and fitness staff is complemented by a wide array of services and amenities including 20 dry and wet treatment rooms, the latest cardiovascular fitness equipment, a 10,000 square-foot indoor swimming pool and a 17,500 square-foot sun terrace.

Mohegan Sun also features a 38,000 square-foot Uncas Ballroom – the Northeast's largest – and more than 100,000 square feet of high-tech and flexible meeting and function areas, including 30 conference and breakout rooms and 30,000 square feet of exhibition space.

An advisory board of meeting and event planners from nationally recognized associations, companies and suppliers has made certain that every facility design and product development fulfills the most taxing demands of today's growing meetings and conventions industry.

As a result, gatherings at Mohegan Sun are an experience without rival anywhere on the East Coast. Golf

Mohegan Sun Country Club at Pautipaug is an 18-hole championship golf course that invites Mohegan Sun guests an opportunity to play on one of the truly hidden gems of southeastern Connecticut. The Mohegan Tribal Gaming Authority (MTGA), the operators of Mohegan Sun, purchased Pautipaug Country Club in Franklin, Connecticut in June of 2007 for more than \$4 million. The golf course was renamed Mohegan Sun Country Club at Pautipaug, and opened as a private facility for members, casino and hotel guests, and convention goers.

Established in 1960, the Pautipaug Country Club is a private 18-hole championship golf course complete with a pro shop, clubhouse, driving range, banquet facility, and swimming pool. It has been recognized statewide for its impeccable greens and lavish fairways, gently rolling through the scenic hills of southeastern Connecticut. Renowned Architect Geoffrey Cornish, who has designed more golf courses in New England than any other architect, designed Pautipaug Country Club. A renovation in 2002 by Architect Steven Kay resulted in several new teeing areas and the most playable bunkers in southern New England.

Mohegan Sun, owned by the Mohegan Tribe, is one of the largest, most distinctive and spectacular entertainment, gaming, shopping and meeting destinations in the United States. LOCATION: Mohegan Sun is located on 240 acres along the banks of the Thames River in the town of Uncasville, Connecticut. It is approximately one mile from the interchange of I-395 and Conn. Rte. 2A, in the heart of the scenic foothills of southeastern Connecticut, where 60 percent of state tourism is concentrated. It is within easy access of New York, Boston, Hartford and Providence and located 15 minutes from the museums, antique shops and waterfront of Mystic Country.

Hirsch Bedner Associates designed the plush 1,200-room, 34-story luxury hotel interiors and meeting spaces.

Casino of the Earth: At nearly 180,000 square feet, Mohegan Sun's Casino of the Earth was unveiled in 1996. Its rich environment highlights the Mohegan culture and the importance of the four seasons in the Mohegan cycle of life. It features more than 3,781 slot machines; 204 gaming tables, including such perennial favorites as blackjack, craps, roulette, pai gow poker, Caribbean stud poker, PokerPro, Keno and baccarat. For the comfort of non-smoking patrons, Casino of the Earth includes the Hall of Lost Tribes, a fully enclosed smoke-free slot room with more than

600 slot machines, and 12 table games such as: war, Texas Hold Em', blackjack, roulette, as well as Wheel of Fortune. It also includes a full-service food and beverage concession including a cocktail bar featuring video poker.

In August 2007, Mohegan Sun unveiled Sunrise Square, located in Casino of the Earth, adjacent to the Race Book. The area includes a 4,000 square-foot authentic Southeast Asian cuisine food court, new bus lobby, juice bar, retail outlet and redesigned gaming space with over 46 table games.

Casino of the Sky: Unveiled in September 2001, the addition of the 119,000 square-foot Casino of the Sky made Mohegan Sun one of the largest gaming complexes in the world. Its show-stopping design elements include the world's largest, fully functional planetarium dome, providing ever-changing cosmic displays, and a dramatic, multi-level onyx and alabaster structure called Wombi Rock, which houses a lounge and a dance floor. Gaming enthusiasts can find nearly 2,411 slot machines and 118 table games, a 3,000 square-foot high-limit lounge and special non-smoking gaming area located underneath a giant turtle shell showcasing the Sky.

Race Book: Mohegan Sun's full-service Race Book is a one-of-a-kind facility that offers state-of-the-art viewing of live horse and greyhound racing events as well as professional Jai Alai. It is the only New England gaming facility to cover the New York Racing Association Circuit (Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga) and Jai Alai. The Race Book is equipped with

over 300 television screens and 222 self-wagering carrels to bring the race to the guests.

Mohegan Sun's Design Elements Bring Mohegan Legends to Life

Three legendary firms join forces to create a triumph of design

Mohegan Sun has evolved into one of the largest, most distinctive entertainment, gaming, shopping and meeting destinations in the United States. Its design elements also serve as a testament to the Mohegan Tribe. At Mohegan Sun, Tribal lore, the cosmos and nature's elements – earth, wind, fire and rain – are transformed into awe-inspiring designs and environments throughout the complex. Those who sojourn there will discover a world unto itself – one that is both architecturally beautiful and culturally meaningful.

The inspired design of Mohegan Sun's multi-dimensional destination is the result of a unique collaborative effort by several of the world's most renowned architectural and design firms. Kohn Pedersen Fox Architects designed Mohegan Sun's dramatic, yet understated exterior and hotel tower, while Rockwell Group has advanced its original Mohegan-inspired designs created for Mohegan Sun's Casino of the Earth by transforming stories of the cosmos into unique environments for the gaming space, retail and restaurant pavilion and hotel lobby. Hirsch Bedner Associates designed the plush 1,200-room, 34-story luxury hotel interiors and vast meeting spaces.

Hotel Tower

The 34-story hotel at Mohegan Sun, one of the tallest buildings in Connecticut, reflects the Mohegan Tribe's sensitivity to the natural landscape and pays homage to the geological and natural forms present on the property's riverfront site. Its three-winged structure features a crystalline-like exterior that was inspired by the rock and smoky quartz crystal the Mohegans used to fashion arrowheads and ceremonial objects. These were used to honor the good spirits

Natural design themes blend with the landscape in the tree-inspired, winged porte cochere, which marks the entry to the Casino of the Sky. The second porte cochere, set within a glade of trees, marks the hotel's entrance. Trees, rocks and water are also present in the hotel interior to create landscapes that represent the surrounding woodlands.

A glass curtain-wall system around the hotel's exterior gently reflects the surrounding area, and the geometry of the hotel and large windows provide panoramic views of the Thames River and surrounding New England landscape. In addition, the faceted tower form and reflectivity of the exterior glass follow the orientation of the sun throughout the day and reflect the changes in seasons.

A cedar forest inspired the 35,000 square-foot hotel lobby. Ten trees made of natural cedar connected by antique copper joints are plumed with sparkling beaded canopies to represent the sacred red cedars. These opulent structures surround a reflecting pool lined with glass mosaic geode tiles arranged to symbolize the layers of Mohegan culture past, present and future.

Casino of the Sky

The Mohegans have long believed that the past, present and future are inexorably linked, and that one cannot exist without the others. This philosophy permeates everything the Mohegans have ever done as a people and is represented by the **Tree of Life**. According to legend:

A tree grew in the middle of the earth after it was created. The tree's root yielded a sprout where the first man grew. Then the tree bent over, touched the earth, and formed another root, which produced an additional sprout where the first woman grew.

At Mohegan Sun, the abstract Tree of Life begins the Trail of Life pathway from old to new, providing a tangible and narrative link between the casinos of the Earth and Sky. Trees represent the creation of the Mohegan Tribe with roots symbolizing tribal

elders, while their branches reach to the sky, expanding outward to support exquisite, back-lit canopies of hand-strung beads.

The Tree of Life, waterfalls, crystal formation and pools form The Shops at Mohegan Sun, and are found along the Trail of Life. The Trail of Life incorporates the suntrails, or curved life paths walked in traditional Mohegan life. Also sometimes called the Path of the Sun, this symbolic trail is often represented with dots, colors and rising and falling curving lines.

Standing at the center of the Casino of the Sky is **Wombi Rock**, an amazing three-story crystal mountain built inside the casino and crafted from more than 12,000 individual plates of hand-selected onyx from quarries in Iran, Pakistan and Mexico. The slabs were then transported to Carrera, Italy where they were fused to glass.

“Wombi” comes from the Mohegan word “wambiyo” meaning “white.” White rocks made of milky quartz hold a central place in Mohegan tradition and have long been used by the tribe in ceremonies to solicit good spirits. In Mohegan tradition, rocks are not merely inanimate objects. They may carry the spirit of those who have shaped them, the power of a specific event, the ability to transform, protective or destructive energies, and the life force of beings. Mohegan Tribal Council meetings of long ago took place at Cohegun Rock, the largest freestanding boulder in New England. The old Mohegan expression “Ne mowe sunsmo?” literally means “Are you coming to the rock?”

Found directly underneath the planetarium dome, Wombi Rock is a meeting place, night club and bar, pulsating with lighting effects to complement the planetarium show.

High above the 115,000 square-foot Casino of the Sky and measuring 150 feet across, Mohegan Sun’s planetarium dome, the world’s largest, incorporates cutting-edge fiber optic technology to project displays of constellations, sun cycles and

stirring clouds. Visitors can view the nighttime sky and constellations as they would appear on a late summer night, including Capricorn the goat, VYGNUS the swan, Orion the hunter and the Big Dipper.

In Mohegan tradition, stars are considered living beings that represent tales of long ago. Their movements guide traditional Mohegan ways of life, signaling when to gather herbs, when to plant crops and when to hunt and fish.

Taughannick Falls is a 55-foot high indoor waterfall flowing down to Chahnameed's Island, which is named after a historic Mohegan figure.

In Mohegan tribal culture, Taughannick Falls represent a treacherous crossing point during the Tribe's migration. Emma Baker, the Mohegans' medicine woman from 1859 to 1917 and mentor of the Tribe's former medicine woman, Gladys Tantaquidgeon, used to go to the hill where Mohegan Church now stands. She would point to the west and say, "we came from upstate New York, through the hills of Taughannick," where there are waterfalls.

River Blue

Mohegan Sun commissioned a towering glass sculpture by world-renowned artist Dale Chihuly. Titled "River Blue," the 10,000-pound masterpiece was created by combining extraordinary artistry with architectural skill. Thousands of richly colored glass components, 2,500 in all, were hand-blown by a team of artisans in Seattle, then fully assembled onsite at Mohegan Sun. The distinctive cobalt blue, silver and clear colored glass sculpture, measuring 14 feet in width, soars 25 feet above visitors, creating a spectacular centerpiece.

The Dubliner

Designed by Anne Browne, a native of Longford, Ireland and owner of Bar None Designs in Ontario, Canada, The Dubliner is an authentic Irish pub.

At the pub's entrance, rich colors, decorative metalwork and an impressive hand-carved sign invite guests to experience a bit of Ireland in Uncasville, Connecticut. The striking black and gold facade with its hand-carved corbels and decorative metal-work offer a welcoming haven for concert-goers, hotel guests, shoppers and conference attendees. Inside, beautiful Irish-made furniture, traditional wood flooring, a cozy fireplace, pictures, hand-painted wall hangings and Celtic imagery remind guests of the pub's Irish theme. The nooks and niches throughout the pub also provide an element of privacy and intimacy that is indicative of an authentic Irish Pub.

One of the more notable design features is the oval-shaped dance floor; the traditional slate flooring mixed with rich velour fabrics is a perfect example of the seamless mix of traditional and contemporary designs. Bruce "Two Dogs" Bozsum was first elected to the Tribal Council in 2004. He won Re-election to the Tribal Council in 2005 and was selected by his fellow Councilors to serve as Chairman of the Mohegan Tribal Council.

"Two Dogs" also serves as a Mohegan Tribal Pipe Carrier, an important traditional position long-honored for its vital role in Mohegan ceremonial activities.

Prior to serving on the Tribal Council, Bozsum was Manager of Cultural Programs where he developed and coordinated a wide variety of programs for Tribal members including the continuation of the Mohegan Language Restoration Project, formation of native flute, singing, dancing, folklore and craft classes and other efforts to celebrate Mohegan culture and heritage.

As a leader within the Tribe's Cultural and Community Programs Department, Bozsum played a key role in the expansion of educational and cultural outreach activities to schools and the public, as well as working on the Green Corn Festival and serving as Wigwam Director and manager of "Cultural Week" at Fort Shantok. His duties also took him across Connecticut and the country as he represented the Mohegan Tribe.

Bozsum attended Norwich public schools and has traveled widely, but when the Mohegan Tribe began building Mohegan Sun Casino, he returned to work on the construction project. He was part of the construction crew that built the road

leading into the casino and assisted with the development and construction of the cultural themes and replications adorning the Sun's Casino of the Earth. Following the opening of the casino, Bozsum became a Bingo Floor Supervisor where he worked to ensure patrons were treated with the respect and appreciation worthy of the Tribe's commitment to being good neighbors.

Museums

Children's Museum of Southeastern Connecticut: The Children's Museum of Southeastern Connecticut is an interactive, hands-on, educational opportunity children up through grade 5. Visit the Health Discovery Center, climb into the kids' clubhouse, or pilot a fishing boat, then head to Capt. Scott's Fish Market. The museum also includes a special area for toddlers. Other hands-on exhibits include the Global Village, an outdoor garden, construction exhibit, live critters, arts & crafts and much more. The Children's Museum is located at 409 Main Street in Niantic. www.childrensmuseumsect.org

Historic Ship Nautilus & Submarine Force Museum: The museum documents the development of submarines, from David Bushnell's Turtle, constructed in 1776 to the

Navy's modern submarines. It is the Navy's official submarine museum. Visitors can tour the NAUTILUS, the first nuclear-powered submarine. There is bus and R/V parking, and a picnic area that has seating for up to 50. The historic ship Nautilus is located at 1 Crystal Lake Road in Groton. www.ussnautilus.org

Lyman Allyn Art Museum was established in 1926 by Harriet Upson Allyn in memory of her father, Lyman Allyn, as a place for local citizens to learn about art and culture. Housed in a handsome Neo-Classical building designed by Charles A. Platt, the permanent collection includes over 10,000 paintings, drawings, prints, sculptures, furniture and decorative arts, with an emphasis on American art from the 18th through 20th centuries. Exhibitions include works from the permanent collection as well as traveling exhibitions of contemporary arts in all media. The museum is located at 625 Williams Street in New London. www.lymanallyn.org

Mystic Seaport -- The Museum of America and the Sea -- is the nation's leading maritime museum. Explore American maritime history firsthand as you climb aboard historic tall ships, stroll through a re-created 19th century coastal village or watch our working preservation shipyard in action. Mystic Seaport is located at 75 Greenmanville Avenue (Route 27) in Mystic. www.mysticseaport.org.

Old Lighthouse Museum: The first government lighthouse in Connecticut was built in 1823. A climb to the tower offers a panoramic view of Long Island Sound, and the public can enjoy exhibits tracing the history of the community first settled in 1649. The lighthouse is located at 7 Water Street in Stonington. www.stoningtonhistory.org/light.htm

Slater Memorial Museum: Situated on the Norwich Free Academy campus this museum has Greek, Roman and Renaissance casts, 17th to 20th century American arts and furnishings, American Indian artifacts, plus Oriental, African and European art. Contemporary artists are also highlighted through changing exhibitions. Slater Memorial Museum is located at 108 Crescent Street in Norwich. www.slatermuseum.org

The Tantaquidgeon Indian Museum is the oldest Native American museum in the country, and was founded in part by Gladys Tantaquidgeon, the Mohegan Tribe's medicine woman. Opened in 1931, the museum has a collection of artifacts made and used by Mohegan Indians. The museum is located at 1819 Norwich-New London Turnpike in Uncasville, 860.848.9145.

Tours and Cruises

Essex Steam Train & Riverboat: 2 1/2 hours of fun for all ages, the 100-year-old Essex Steam Train takes guests on a nostalgic tour of some of the Connecticut River Valley, during which guests meet up with a riverboat for a spectacular cruise heading north on the Connecticut River toward Gillette's Castle. For an even more memorable experience, visitors can enjoy the dinner train. Rides take place, rain or shine, May through October. The Essex Steam Train & Riverboat is located at 1 Railroad Avenue, just off Route 154 in Essex. www.essexsteamtrain.com

Connecticut River Expeditions: RiverQuest offers a wide variety of tours of the Connecticut River including its annual eagle cruises, where visitors can spot bald eagles nesting along the river's banks, sunset cruises, and daily eco tours. Local history, expert knowledge on floral and fauna, and fabulous views of large and historic homes, and quiet coastal areas abound. RiverQuest leaves from the Connecticut River Museum at 67 Main Street in Essex. www.ctriverexpeditions.org

Marine Life

A visit to **Mystic Aquarium and Institute for Exploration:** will get you as close as possible to ocean animals--reach in and touch a ray or take part in a special ray feeding program. Go beak to nose with an African penguin, get eye to eye with an alligator and feel the splash of a beluga whale all in interactive programs which let visitors touch the animals. Other adventures include a sea lion show in the marine theater and the thrill of the ride on the XD Motion Theater. Mystic Aquarium is also home to the world's only exhibits based on Dr. Robert Ballard's expeditions, such as Return to Titanic and PT109, an exhibit that follows the discovery of John F.

Kennedy's PT boat. Mystic Aquarium & Institute for Exploration is located at 55 Coogan Boulevard in Mystic. www.mysticaquarium.org

Historic Sites/Homes

Gillette Castle State Park: Located at 67 River Road in Hadlyme (East Haddam) is a restored 1919 castle that belonged to actor William Gillette and underwent a major renovation in 1998.

Monte Cristo Cottage: The boyhood home of playwright Eugene O'Neill, this National Register Landmark at 325 Pequot Avenue in New London is filled with memorabilia and offers occasional readings.

Nathan Lester House: At Long Cove and Vinegar Hill Roads in Gales Ferry, this 18th century farmhouse still retains its original out-buildings and museum on a 100-acre site crossed with hiking trails.

Thomas Lee House & Little Boston School: One of Connecticut's oldest frame houses, this building still possesses framing details; located on Route 156 in Old Lyme.

Parks/Nature

Connecticut College Arboretum: Situated at Connecticut College on Williams Street, in New London, this arboretum contains gardens, hiking trails and 700 acres of native plant collections.

Denison Pequotsepos Nature Center: Seven miles of hiking trails pattern this 125-acre sanctuary. Birdwatching is available in four distinct habitats and so too are birds of prey, kept in special flight enclosures. Guided trips and tours include hikes, and kayak excursions. A museum and gift shop rounds out this outdoor center, open year-long. The Nature Center is located at 109 Pequotsepos Road in Mystic. www.dpnc.org.

Vineyards

The Connecticut Wine Trail features a number of local wineries and vineyards including **Stonington Vineyards**, featuring daily wine tastings and a guided winery tour (523 Taughwonk Road in Stonington www.stoningtonvineyards.org), **Jonathan Edwards Winery**, a Connecticut and California based operation on a beautiful 48-acre hilltop vineyard in North Stonington (74 Chester Maine Road in North Stonington www.jedwardswinery.com), and **Chamard Vineyards**, which sits on 40 acres of gently sloping fields on the Connecticut Coast (115 Cow Hill Road in Clinton www.chamard.com).

Visitors who prefer a “cold one” can stop at **Cottrell Brewing Co.**, a microbrewery at 100 Mechanic Street, Pawcatuck, to sample their ales and lagers.

Performing Arts

The **Garde Arts Center** is home to live music of all genres, Broadway shows, opera, dance and more. The non-profit, 1,400-seat theater was restored to represent its beginnings in 1926 as a movie/vaudeville house. The Garde is located at 325 State Street in New London. www.gardearts.org

The Spirit of Broadway is an intimate, 74-seat, professional, award-winning black box theater which produces the very best in off-Broadway, regional and world premiere productions. Nationally recognized for artistic excellence and commitment to producing the finest in new works for the stage, The Spirit of Broadway Theater combines the best in regional talent with professional actors to create an unequalled theater experience. In addition to theatrical productions the theater presents the top names in New York City professional Cabaret talent throughout the year. Located at 24 Chestnut Street in Norwich. www.spiritofbroadway.org

The Goodspeed Opera House opened in 1877 to provide Mr. Goodspeed a venue for his love of theater. After his death, the Victorian-style theater went from serving as a militia base during WWI to a general store to a storage depot for the State of

Connecticut Highway Department. The building was restored to a theater in 1959 and now this Tony Award winning theater produces three musicals each April through December season. The Goodspeed Opera House is located at 6 Main Street in East Haddam. www.goodspeedmusicals.org

Shopping

Southeastern Connecticut also features a number of shopping opportunities, both for contemporary items and antiques. At the **Olde Mystic Village**, Coogan Boulevard at Route 27, in Mystic, the goods and services are modern, with more than 60 shops, restaurants and a movie theater, but the environment is definitely 18th century. Shopping outlets popular with customers include **Tanger Outlet Center** in Westbrook, and **Clinton Crossing Premium Outlets** in Clinton, and if antique shopping is in the plans the small shops of Putnam, Connecticut are not to be missed.

Accommodations

Mohegan Sun offers first-class accommodations at its 1,200-room hotel, but visitors can also choose to stay at a variety of nearby hotels, including the **Comfort Suites Norwich, Courtyard by Marriott** and **Holiday Inn**, all in Norwich, approximately a five- to 10-minute drive from Mohegan Sun; and **Comfort Inn, Days Inn, Hyatt Place, Residence Inn** and the **Mystic Marriott** located in Mystic about 20 to 30 minutes away.
